## A trip back to the days of Hodgson homes

The history of the Hodgson home lies hidden in Dover center. Nestled at the center the hustle and bustle of Dover's downtown, sit 16 of the 18 remaining Hodgson homes still standing in town. This Saturday, April 5th, Paul Tedesco, president of the Dover Historical Society, will take residents on a walk back in time, on a voyage back to the hay day of the Hodgson prefabricated home.

Dover resident Ernest Franklin (E.F.) Hodgson was the original man behind our nation's prefabricated homes and spearheaded a revolution that made consumers crazy for the simplicity of easily assembled homes. Hodgson called himself "America's First Prefabricator", as his company preceded other popular prefabricating ones like Aladdin, Sears and Montgomery Ward.

Hodgson grew up on Farm Street in Dover. His interest in raising poultry on his parent's dairy farm motivated him to create brooders and coops, or portable, prefabricated houses for chickens. His Peep-o-Day poultry homes were first introduced to the market in 1892.

After creating coops and brooders, Hodgson moved onto working on creating small, prefabricated summer cottages and car garages (auto stables). The Hodgson Home became immensely popular and became popping up all over the world. The company even created summer homes for the Vanderbilts and Queen.

Tedesco and his son James spent years researching the E.F. Hodgson Company and compiled a book based on their research, dubbed "Portable and Prefabricated Houses of the Thirties: The E.F. Hodgson Company 1935 and 1939 Catalogues". The book was released last year and peaked many residents' interest in the history of the Hodgson Company. When the Hodgson family and business was selected as a focal point of last year's Old Home Day, Tedesco and his son organized a map of Dover center, where a majority of the remaining Hodgson homes still stand.

This year, Tedesco decided he wanted to do something to introduce even more Dover residents to the history of the Hodgson home.

Ol realized that most of the 16-18 structures left were within three-quarters of a mile of the Sawin, so that the walk would be feasible in an hour and a half," explained Tedesco.

The walking tour will take participants on a stroll through Dover center, from Dedham Street, down Centre Street and onto Haven Street, before lopping onto Church Street and Springdale Avenue, taking a small trip to Old Meadow Road, and then back to the Sawin Museum. Walkers will be introduced to the main features and nuances of the Hodgson homes, from the wedge key-bolting system, which held the walls of each home together with a lasting grip, to the characteristic plate used to distinguish each Hodgson home.

Tedesco is hopeful that participants will not only learn a little more about the history of the E.F. Hodgson Company, but also the heritage of their hometown.
